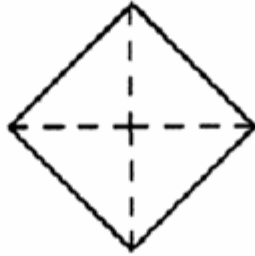

Fold all corners to the center of the paper.



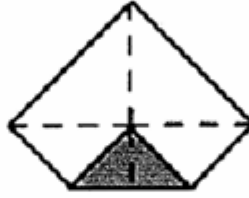

you just made are face down.



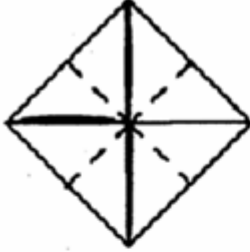

to the center of the paper.



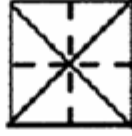

Now your paper should look like this.



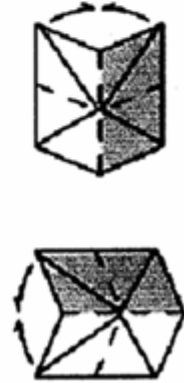

something like this.



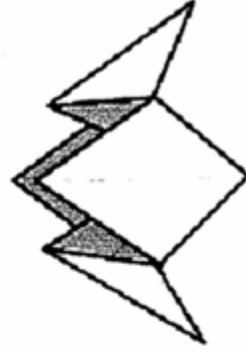
